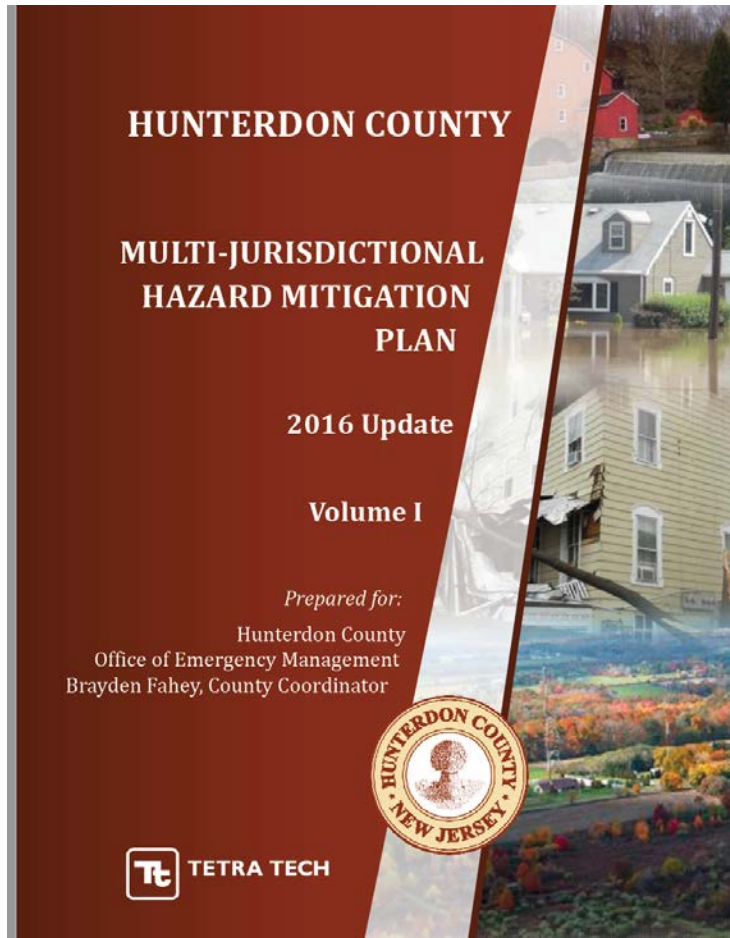

Hazard Mitigation Plan - State



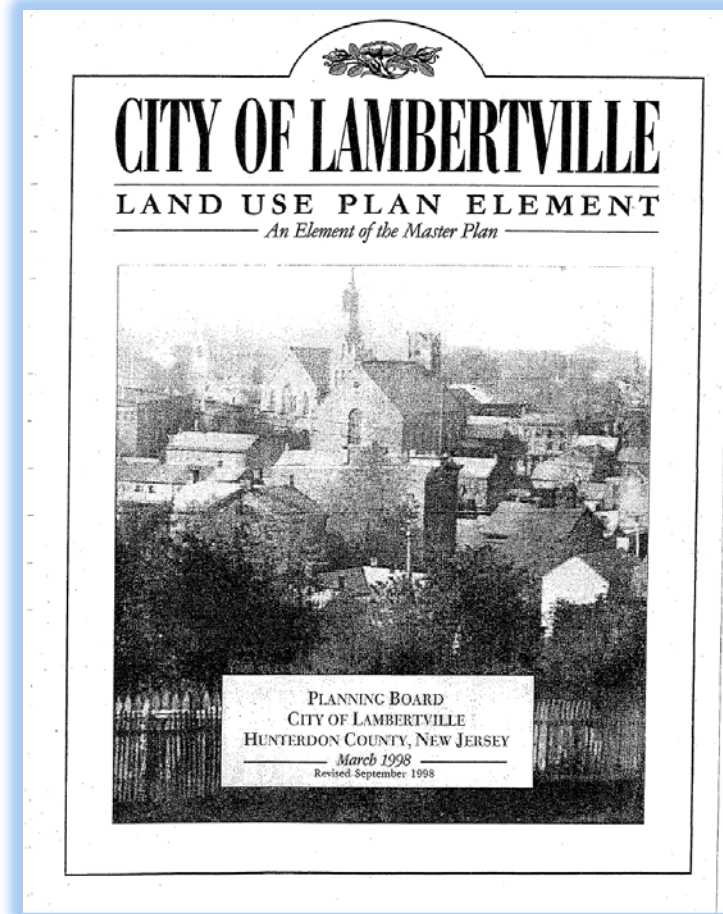
